Students will prepare for their transition to King's with an Introduction to Brecht, Stanislavski and Artaud.


Styles of Theatre

Physical Theatre

Having explored the physicality of characters in AMND, students will build on those skills to create their own pieces of physical theatre. Focus on Le Coq and Berkoff.

Year 7

A Midsummer Night's Dream

Students will consolidate their knowledge of interpreting scripts whilst beginning to develop their theatre design skills and knowledge. The conventions of the Globe will also be explored.

Introduction to Script

Students will understand the conventions of scripts and how to analyse playwright's intentions. Students will begin to write their own scripts



Jabberwocky


Students will apply their skills from Term 1 and 2 and apply them to a piece of stimulus from Lewis Carroll in a creative and inspiring way

Tension and Atmosphere

Students will explore how to create tension and atmosphere through a stimulus driven topic. This will continue to develop skills from the Jabberwocky
