
School Attendance

School attendance remains a priority at Fairlands Middle School for all our pupils. Evidence from the Department for Education shows that pupils who are successful in attaining higher grades at KS2 and KS4 also have the highest levels of attendance. There are also huge social and emotional benefits for pupils who have strong attendance.

Last term, I sent out a general attendance letter via the school bulletin which outlined some attendance data. The information identified the amount of learning that is missed from being absent. A pupil with 95% attendance for the academic year will miss 50 hours of lesson time, whilst a pupil with 90% attendance will miss 100 hours of learning.

The Department for Education now define any pupil with 90% or lower attendance as a 'persistent absentee'. At Fairlands Middle School our attendance target for pupils is 97%. If you have any concerns regarding attendance and require any additional information or support, please contact your child's Tutor or Head of Year. By working together, we aim to ensure strong attendance for all pupils at Fairlands.
