

#### James Bond Style

In informal writing, dashes can be used to separate two independent main clauses or to add parenthesis within a sentence.

Look at the main clauses below:

- Either, add a dash at the end of the clause and then add another main clause with some additional dramatic information, e.g. It was a long wait every minute felt like an hour.
- Or, add a pair of dashes into the sentence to demarcate an added word or phrase of parenthesis, e.g. James Bond – the international man of mystery – jumped straight over the car, rolled and ran off into the woods.
  - 1. His Aston Martin pulled into the car park.
  - 2. James Bond scanned the room.
  - 3. The underground lair was quiet apart from the low hum of machinery.
- 4. Miss Moneypenny smiled across the room.
